### **Tire Amnesty Days**

The City will be holding four Tire Amnesty Days during 2020. These events are jointly sponsored by the City of Hesperia and a grant from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle).

On Tire Amnesty Days, residents can drop-off, freeof-charge, up to nine passenger car and light truck tires, with rims removed, at Advance Disposal located at 17105 Mesa Street, between 7:30 a.m. and 12 p.m. Please enter the facility from Santa Fe only.

For your convenience, the following dates have been scheduled for Tire Amnesty Days.

February 1, 2020

August 8, 2020

April 11, 2020

October 24, 2020

Tire Amnesty Days are open to Hesperia residents only and proof of residency, such as a valid driver's license or current water bill, is required. Under the terms of the grant, tires from commercial dealers cannot be accepted.

### Solid Waste Disposal Guidelines

In order to provide the most efficient disposal and recycling program, please follow these disposal guidelines when setting out your trash containers.

- Place all trash containers curbside by 6 am on scheduled collection day.
- Place trash containers against the curb or right-of-way with handles facing your home.
- Place trash containers at least two feet away from cars, mail boxes and other containers.
   Blocked access to containers could cause a missed trash collection.
  - To reduce litter, bag trash before placing in trash containers.

All materials must be placed in the trashcontainers in order to be collected. If you have extra green waste or bulky items, please contact Advance Disposal at (760) 244-9773 to make collection arrangements.


### Celebrate Earth Day Every Day

Officially, Earth Day is celebrated on April 22, but it is important to remember that Earth Day can be every day. Just making simple changes in your lifestyle can have a significant impact on the environment. The following are a few tips to consider when going about your everyday life:

- Recycle beverage containers.
- Reduce waste by using both sides of paper, buy in bulk, use reusable grocery bags and drink containers, and repair broken items.
- Donate items to charity.
- Don't litter; use trash containers at all times.
- Lower electricity bills by changing to fluorescent lightbulbs.
- Install solar panels.
- Save water by taking shorter showers, fixing leaky faucets and removing water thirsty lawns.







### Bulky Item Picktup Program

In order to reduce illegal dumping, and as a convenience to their customers, Advance Disposal will pick up large items curbside, for free, from single family residences and multi-family complexes.

Single-family residences can schedule a pick-up four (4) times per year for a maximum of eight (8) bulky items per year. Advance Disposal will not be obligated to collect items left at the curb after 6 am or without a scheduled appointment.

Multi-family residential complexes can schedule bulky waste collections ten (10) times per year for each time per week that the complex receives regular trash collection service. Advance Disposal will not be required to pick up more than eight (8) bulky items in a single collection trip.

Proper disposal of hazardous and electronic waste is important since our drinking water comes from groundwater. Residents can dispose of the following items for free at the City's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility:

- Motor Oil & Oil Filters
- Paint Products
- Pool Supplies
- Household Cleaners
- Auto & Household Batteries

- Medications
- TVs & Computer Monitors
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Pesticides & Fertilizers
- Medical Syringes

The HHW facility is located at 17443 Lemon Street and is open from 9 am to 1 pm Tuesday and Thursday and 9 am to 3 pm on Saturday. Business hazardous waste will not be accepted. For additional information visit www.cityofhesperia.us/HHW.

### Turf Replacement Rebate Programs

One of the best ways to look for water savings is in your own yard. More than 50 percent of water use is outside, watering lawns and gardens. Taking steps to reduce outdoor water use is important to ensuring a reliable water supply and offers many benefits including saving money, creating vibrant yards, reducing energy use, protecting natural resources and reducing landscape maintenance.

The Department of Water Resources (DWR) has a rebate program for removing turf and replacing it with landscapes that require little water at California single-family residences to support the State's drought response.

The \$24 million program budget is expected to support the conversion of more than 10 million square feet of turf, or approximately 20 percent of the statewide goal of 50 million square feet of turf.

- Turn off your computer and monitor when not in use.


 Plug home electronics such as TVs and DVD players into power strips, and turn the power strips off when the equipment is not in use.

• Take short showers instead of baths.


 Wash only full loads of dishes and clothes.

### Adopter-Street Program

Litter strewn along the streets creates a poor image of the City, pollutes our community's environment and tends to lower the quality of life for our citizens.

The Adopt-a-Street Program allows volunteers to adopt a one-mile section of a street and pledge to remove litter and weeds along the street at least four times a year, for a two-year period. The program is free and supplies are provided.

Individuals, schools, clubs, businesses, churches and families are encouraged to get involved. Interested volunteers must complete an application and attend a safety orientation once application is approved.


### Green Resolutions for a New Year
