
Green Resolutions for a New Year

Proper Hazardous Waste Disposal

Proper disposal of hazardous and electronic waste is important since our drinking water comes from groundwater. Residents can dispose of the following items for free at the City's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility:

- Motor Oil & Oil Filters
- Paint Products
- Pool Supplies
- Household Cleaners
- Auto & Household Batteries
- Medications
- TVs & Computer Monitors
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Pesticides & Fertilizers
- Medical Syringes

The HHW facility is located at 17443 Lemon Street and is open from 9 am to 1 pm Tuesday and Thursday and 9 am to 3 pm on Saturday. Business hazardous waste will not be accepted. For additional information visit www.cityofhesperia.us/HHW.


Turf Replacement Rebate Programs

One of the best ways to look for water savings is in your own yard. More than 50 percent of water use is outside, watering lawns and gardens. Taking steps to reduce outdoor water use is important to ensuring a reliable water supply and offers many benefits including saving money, creating vibrant yards, reducing energy use, protecting natural resources and reducing landscape maintenance.

Below are lawn removal tips created by the Department of Water Resources (DWR):

- Sheet Mulching: Install layers of cardboard and newspaper under several inches of mulch.
- Physical Removal: Labor-intensive and creates a pile of debris.
- Solarization: Solarization takes several weeks and can temporarily remove the healthy microorganisms in the soil.

Energy Efficiency Practices

Did you know saving energy will reduce your utility bills and your carbon footprint? Practice these easy, low-cost and no-cost ways to save energy.

- Install a programmable thermostat.
- Use compact fluorescent light bulbs.
- Air dry dishes instead of using your dishwasher's drying cycle.
- Turn off your computer and monitor when not in use.
- Plug home electronics such as TVs and DVD players into power strips, and turn the power strips off when the equipment is not in use.
- Lower the thermostat on your hot water heater to 120°F.
- · Take short showers instead of baths.
- Wash only full loads of dishes and clothes.
- Look for the Energy Star® label on home appliances and products.

Green Waste Program

Residents can separate out green waste materials by bagging the material and placing the bag in the residential tan carts. But do you have more green waste than your tan carts can hold during Spring and Fall?

Single-family residential customers who occasionally have excess green waste may schedule a special green waste pick up one week in advance of the regular residential service. Excess green waste must be securely bundled and tied or placed in tied

plastic bags and placed next to the tan carts on the scheduled pick-up day. Customers who schedule excess green waste pickups more than four (4) times per year may be required to get additional tan carts or a bin at an additional cost.

Tire Amnesty Days

The City will be holding four Tire Amnesty Days during 2021. These events are jointly sponsored by the City of Hesperia and a grant from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle).

On Tire Amnesty Days, residents can drop-off, free-of-charge, up to nine passenger car and light truck tires, with rims removed, at Advance Disposal located at 17105 Mesa Street, between 7:30 a.m. and 12 p.m. Please enter the facility from Santa Fe only.

For your convenience, the following dates have been scheduled for Tire Amnesty Days.

• February 6, 2021

August 14, 2021

April 10, 2021

October 23, 2021

Tire Amnesty Days are open to Hesperia residents only and proof of residency, such as a valid driver's license or current water bill, is required. Under the terms of the grant, tires from commercial dealers cannot be accepted.

Solid Waste Disposal Guidelines

In order to provide the most efficient disposal and recycling program, please follow these disposal guidelines when setting out your trash containers.

- Place all trash containers curbside by 6 am on scheduled collection day.
- Place trash containers against the curb or rightof-way with handles facing your home.
- Place trash containers at least two feet away from cars, mail boxes and other containers.
 Blocked access to containers could cause a missed trash collection.
- To reduce litter, bag trash before placing in trash containers.

All materials must be placed in the trash containers in order to be collected. If you have extra green waste or bulky items, please contact Advance Disposal at (760) 244-9773 to make collection arrangements.

Bulky Item Pick-up Program

In order to reduce illegal dumping, and as a convenience to their customers, Advance Disposal will pick up large items curbside, for free, from single family residences and multi-family complexes.

Single-family residences can schedule a pick-up four (4) times per year for a maximum of eight (8) bulky items per year. Advance Disposal will not be obligated to collect items left at the curb after 6 am or without a scheduled appointment.

Multi-family residential complexes can schedule bulky waste collections ten (10) times per year for each time per week that the complex receives regular trash collection service. Advance Disposal will not be required to pick up more than eight (8) bulky items in a single collection trip.

Adopt-a-Street Program
